ACHE Overview

The Association for Continuing Higher Education is an organization made up of professionals from adult continuing education units worldwide, as well as other industry professionals whose primary interest is adult continuing education. Begun in 1939 as the Association of University Evening Colleges, ACHE has evolved to become an organization dedicated to serving the entire spectrum of continuing higher education in the United States and internationally.

Belief in the values of professional development, collegiality and service guide the mission of ACHE. The entire range of rapid change in higher education – the success of evening programs, the expansion of continuing education, the growth in number of adult students, the impact of technology, and the needs of training to sustain economic development – all provide added importance to ACHE and its commitment to serve the professional development and growth of its members. Today, ACHE services influence all types of continuing higher education activities.

ACHE has members throughout the United States & Canada. There are approximately 1500 individual members representing over 400 different institutions and organizations. ACHE is divided geographically into 8 regions.
